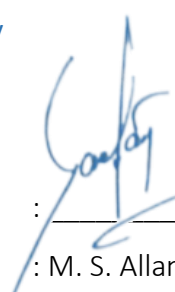

Project Details	Description
Project No	: PPF-FBIFDPH-OMDC-0012-REV-003
Project Locations	: Odisha (OD), Jharkhand (JH), Uttar Pradesh (UP), Bihar (BI), and West Bengal (WB)
Target Distribution (Weekly)	: 1,000 Food Packets distributed across any two states every Friday (500 packets per state, 1,000 packets total)
Cost per Food Packet	: ₹120.00 (includes cooking, transportation, banners, photography, and administration expenses) (One Hundred Twenty)
Total Weekly Cost	: ₹1,20,000.00 (for 1,000 food packets per Friday) (One Lakhs Twenty Thousand)
Total Monthly Cost	: ₹6,00,000.00 (for 5 Fridays) (Six Lakhs)
Distribution Plan (Weekly)	: 1,000 packets distributed across two states per Friday (500 packets per state).

1. Project Overview

The "Friday Blessings Initiative" aims to provide essential food supplies to underserve and economically vulnerable Muslim communities in rural and urban areas of Odisha, Jharkhand, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, and West Bengal. This initiative will involve the distribution of food packets every Friday, alongside prayers for humanity, fostering unity and solidarity among communities. The food packets will be distributed exclusively to those who attend prayers at the mosque.

Each Friday, 1,000 food packets will be distributed across two states. The distribution will be done at four different mosques, with each mosque receiving 250 packets. The mosques will be chosen randomly every week, ensuring that no single mosque receives the food packets consecutively.

The initiative will also involve prayers for the welfare of all mankind, promoting empathy and collective support.

2. Objectives

Objective	Description
Food Distribution	Provide 1,000 food packets every Friday to families in need who attend prayers at the mosque.
Community Support	Strengthen community ties by involving local mosques in food distribution and organizing prayers for the well-being of all mankind.
Livelihood Support	Foster a sense of well-being and hope among marginalized communities by providing consistent access to food.
Humanitarian Outreach	Serve underprivileged communities in rural and urban areas of Odisha, Jharkhand, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, and West Bengal.
Mosque Empowerment	Empower mosques as community centers for humanitarian efforts, supporting local needs.

3. Target Areas and Distribution Details

Distribution Plan:

- Every Friday, 1,000 food packets will be distributed across two states.
- Each state will receive 500 food packets, divided between two mosques (250 packets per mosque).
- The mosques will be selected randomly every week to ensure that different mosques benefit each time.
- The food packets will be distributed exclusively to those who attend prayers at the mosque, ensuring that only those actively participating in the Friday prayers receive the support.

4. Estimated Number of Mosques by State

State	Muslim Population	Estimated Number of Mosques	Notes
Uttar Pradesh	38.5 million (19.26%)	45,000 to 50,000	A large Muslim population with mosques spread across urban and rural areas.
West Bengal	24.6 million (27%)	35,000 to 40,000	Significant Muslim population in both urban centers and rural districts.
Jharkhand	4.78 million (14.53%)	5,000 to 6,000	Smaller Muslim population, mosques mainly in urban and rural areas.
Odisha	1.8 million (2.17%)	2,500 to 3,000	Smaller Muslim population, mosques mostly in urban areas and rural pockets.
Bihar	16.9 million (16.9%)	25,000 to 30,000	Large Muslim population, mosques widespread in urban and rural regions.

Key Points for the Estimates:

- **Uttar Pradesh:** The state has the highest number of mosques due to its large Muslim population, spread across both urban centers (Lucknow, Kanpur, Varanasi) and rural areas.
- **West Bengal:** A significant number of mosques in urban areas like Kolkata and in rural districts with large Muslim populations.
- **Jharkhand:** A smaller Muslim population with mosques concentrated in urban centers such as Ranchi and Jamshedpur.
- **Odisha:** A smaller Muslim population leads to fewer mosques, mainly in urban centers like Bhubaneswar and some rural areas.
- **Bihar:** A large Muslim population, particularly in rural areas, resulting in widespread mosques across urban and rural districts.

Team Setup	A dedicated team will visit different mosques each Friday to coordinate the food distribution and prayers for humanity.
Partnership with Mosques	Collaboration with mosques in each state to distribute food packets and organize prayers for the well-being of all mankind.
Logistics & Distribution	Coordination with local teams for the timely transportation and distribution of food packets every Friday.
Volunteer Involvement	Local volunteers and mosque members will assist with food preparation and distribution, ensuring community participation.
Monitoring & Evaluation	Continuous monitoring to ensure that food reaches the intended recipients, with regular feedback from local mosques and communities.

7. Expected Impact

Improved Nutrition	Provision of nutritious food to families who may not have access to adequate meals.
