OMDC Education Center will offer education from grades 1 to 7, primarily in Urdu and Hindi for primary education, with the curriculum thereafter following a comprehensive, modern education structure aligned with Northern education standards. The school will equip students with both foundational knowledge and essential life skills, creating opportunities for success in both personal and academic pursuits.

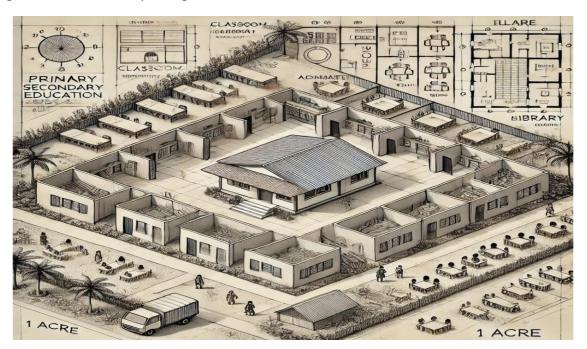
This project is designed to have a lasting impact on marginalized communities by enhancing educational accessibility and equity. The school will serve as a model for similar initiatives across other underserved regions in Odisha, Jharkhand, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, and West Bengal.

Key Features of OMDC Education Center

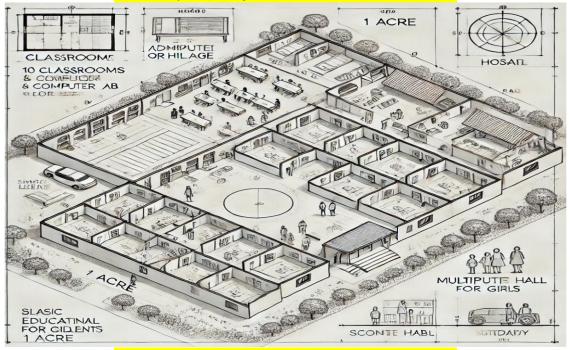
- **Total Student Capacity:** 300 students, with a 60% focus on local students and 40% for out-of-state students.
- Free Education for Underprivileged: 70% of the students will receive free education, covering all educational expenses, including books, uniforms, and school supplies. This will cater to those from economically disadvantaged backgrounds.
- **Nominal Fee Education:** The remaining 30% of students will be charged a nominal fee, ensuring affordability while still maintaining the quality of education.
- Primary Education: Instruction will be offered in Urdu/Hindi, ensuring that students from rural Muslim communities can thrive in their native languages before transitioning to a broader curriculum.
- **Secondary Education:** Following primary education, courses will continue with modern, comprehensive academic subjects, with students receiving government-equivalent certifications upon successful completion of the 7th-grade board exams.
- **Modern Facilities:** The school will feature state-of-the-art laboratories, libraries, sports facilities, and digital learning tools to provide students with a well-rounded education.
- **Cultural Enrichment:** The school will also offer subjects in Yoga, Sports, Debate, and Islamic Culture to nurture the mind, body, and spirit of students, fostering holistic development.
- **Food, Accommodation, and Boarding:** Free food, accommodation, and boarding will be provided to eligible students under the poverty line. This includes complete accommodation for students from across India who meet the criteria for admission.
- **Scholarships and Support:** Scholarships will be available, ensuring that even the most disadvantaged students have access to the resources they need to succeed.

Equivalence to Government Certification: The academic certification from OMDC Education Center
will be recognized and equivalent to government-issued certification, allowing students to continue
their educational journey or pursue careers with the same validity as those from government
schools.

The **OMDC** Education Center will stand as a beacon of hope and opportunity, empowering the youth of rural Muslim communities to break the cycle of poverty through education. The project aims to create lasting social change by focusing on the transformative power of education, with special emphasis on meeting the needs of underprivileged children.

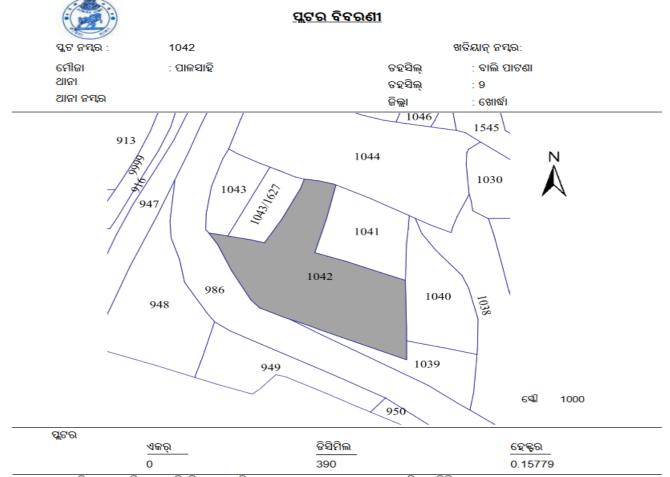

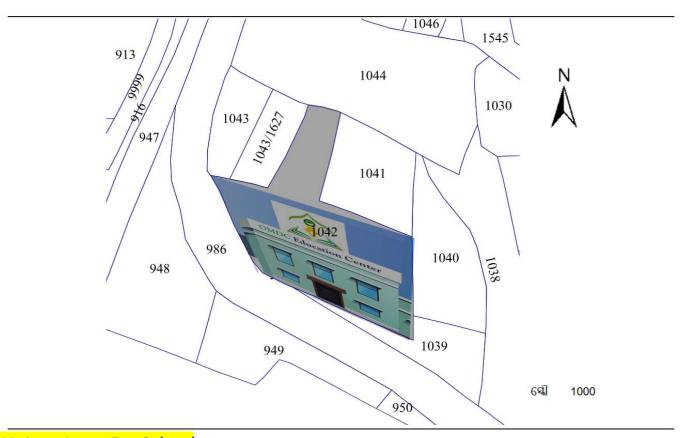

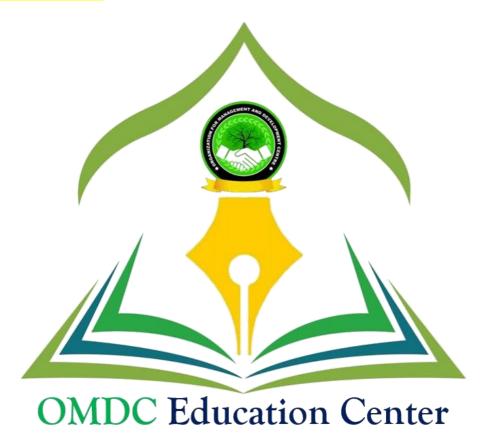

Geographical Overview of Baharana

Baharana is a village in Nimapada Tehsil, Puri District, Odisha, located 43 km east of the district headquarters in Puri and 44 km from the state capital, Bhubaneswar. The village has a total population of 1,243 with 352 houses as per the 2011 Census. The literacy rate is 78.8%, with female literacy at 36.9%. The surrounding areas include villages like Payara, Chhanijanga, and Tulasipur. Baharana is part of a culturally rich and historically significant region, with strong community ties and a need for educational infrastructure to support its youth.

Objectives of the Project

1. To Establish a Comprehensive Educational Environment:

• The primary objective is to create a well-rounded learning environment for 300 students, including 150 boarders and 150 day scholars, where both academic excellence and personal growth are prioritized.

2. To Ensure Proper Staffing for Smooth Operations:

To hire and manage an effective team of educators and support staff, including teachers, administrative staff, caretakers, and other personnel, ensuring that all roles are filled appropriately to cater to the needs of students and the smooth running of the institution.

3. To Provide Quality Accommodation and Meals for Boarding Students:

The aim is to ensure that all boarding students are provided with comfortable living accommodations, nutritious meals, and necessary care, ensuring their safety and wellbeing.

4. To Ensure Inclusivity for Muslim Students:

Provide a dedicated Muslim community space for religious practices, including prayer rooms, Quranic studies, and Islamic teachings, ensuring that Muslim students feel included and supported in their spiritual journey.

5. To Maintain Financial Sustainability:

 To manage school finances efficiently, keeping operational expenses within budget, ensuring that all areas—staff salaries, accommodation, utilities, and student services are adequately funded and balanced.

6. To Promote Holistic Development:

• The objective is to focus not just on academics but also on physical education, extracurricular activities, and spiritual development, creating a comprehensive curriculum that nurtures students' overall growth.

7. To Ensure Safety and Security of the Campus:

 To implement security protocols that ensure the safety of both day scholars and boarding students, including security guards, caretakers, and proper monitoring systems.

8. To Provide a Comfortable and Productive Learning Space:

 Create a conducive environment for learning with proper facilities such as classrooms, sports fields, and utility services (internet, water, electricity) for uninterrupted learning.

9. To Implement a Transparent Financial and Operational System:

 Develop a clear financial tracking system for monthly expenses and revenue, ensuring transparency in the management of school funds.

10. To Offer an Inclusive and Supportive Education System:

 To ensure that the school caters to students of all backgrounds and needs, including religious education (specifically Islamic education for Muslim students), sports, and individualized attention.

Scope of the Project

1. Educational Services:

The project involves the establishment of an educational institution that offers academic programs for 300 students, split between day scholars and boarding students. The curriculum will include standard subjects as well as physical education, sports, and religious studies, with a dedicated program for Muslim students, including Quranic studies and Islamic education.

2. Staffing:

The project scope includes recruiting and maintaining a staff of 4 class teachers, a headmaster, one accountant, two clerks, one PT teacher, one sports teacher, one religious teacher for Islamic education, and other supporting staff such as cooks, caretakers, office boys, tea boys, and security guards. All staff members will be trained and equipped to handle their respective responsibilities.

3. Accommodation and Boarding Facilities:

o Providing dormitory-style accommodations for 150 boarding students, which includes ensuring safe living spaces, regular maintenance, and a nutritious food system.

4. Catering and Meal Services:

o Offering meal services for both day scholars and boarders, ensuring that meals are balanced, healthy, and suitable for the students' nutritional needs, with special provisions for halal food for Muslim students.

5. Infrastructure and Facilities:

The project will include the construction or renovation of classrooms, dormitories, sports facilities, staff rooms, and utility areas. The infrastructure will be modern and efficient, catering to all student needs. The school will have designated prayer rooms for Muslim students, ensuring they have a space for daily prayers and religious activities.

6. Safety and Security:

o Implementing comprehensive security measures, such as hiring security personnel, setting up surveillance, and ensuring all school activities are conducted safely.

7. Administrative Operations:

 Setting up administrative processes and systems to handle day-to-day school operations including attendance, student records, finance management, and academic tracking.

8. Financial Management:

 Developing a transparent budgeting and financial management system to ensure the school operates within its financial means, tracking staff salaries, food expenses, utility bills, and other operational costs.

9. Maintenance and Cleaning:

 Providing regular cleaning and maintenance services for both academic and accommodation areas to ensure a hygienic and comfortable environment for students and staff.

10. Sports and Extracurricular Activities:

o Offering opportunities for sports and extracurricular activities such as games, music, arts, and clubs, enhancing students' physical and creative development.

11. Religious and Moral Education:

 Offering religious education classes tailored to the cultural and spiritual needs of the students, particularly Islamic education for Muslim students, including Quranic studies, Islamic history, and teachings.

12. Performance Monitoring and Reporting:

• Regular assessments and feedback systems will be put in place to monitor the performance of both students and staff, ensuring continuous improvement.

13. **Technology Integration:**

The school will integrate technology for learning, administrative purposes, and communication, ensuring that both students and staff benefit from modern resources.

Key Limitations and Constraints

- **Budgetary Constraints:** The project must adhere to a set budget for infrastructure, staffing, and operations. All expenses need to be managed efficiently to ensure financial sustainability.
- **Staffing Availability:** There may be limitations in recruiting qualified teachers, including Islamic teachers for religious education, and support staff based on geographical location, availability, and salary standards.

- **Time Constraints:** The setup of infrastructure and recruitment of staff will be bound by specific timelines to ensure the school opens within the desired academic year.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** The project must comply with local educational regulations, health and safety standards, and labor laws in terms of hiring practices, facilities, and student care.

- **Operational School with Full Capacity:** A fully functioning school that accommodates 300 students, providing them with high-quality education and accommodation, while addressing the specific needs of Muslim students.

3. Accommodation for Hostel Students:

- **Kids Caretakers (2 staff):** Supervising students in the dormitories, ensuring students' wellbeing, hygiene, and proper conduct. They will also assist in organizing recreational activities.
- **Security Guards (2 staff):** Providing security for the boarding students. Ensuring that the premises are safe at night and providing emergency assistance if required.
- **Tea Boy & Office Boy (1 each):** Assisting with serving tea and running errands for the students.

Accommodation Services:

- **Meals:** Breakfast, lunch, and dinner are provided to the 150 boarding students by the school kitchen.
- **Security:** Continuous monitoring by security staff to ensure students are safe.
- **Caretaking:** Kids caretakers will look after the children's daily needs, such as assisting them with settling into their rooms, ensuring they have all required supplies, and checking up on them regularly.

4. Day Scholars:

- Number of Day Scholars: 150
- Services for Day Scholars:
 - Classroom Education: Day scholars will receive the same level of educational services as the boarding students.
 - Sports & Physical Education: Day scholars will participate in physical activities, sports, and games with the PT Teacher and Sports Teacher.

5. Staffing Requirements Breakdown:

1. Classroom Teachers (4):

- One teacher per class. Each teacher will handle a specific subject (Science, Math, English, and another subject like Social Studies).
- The teachers will prepare lesson plans, manage classroom activities, assign homework, and evaluate students.

2. Headmaster (1):

• The headmaster will manage the entire school operation. This includes overseeing the academic, administrative, and accommodation sections, ensuring smooth running, and setting educational goals.

3. Clerks (2):

• Clerks will handle all administrative duties like maintaining student records, processing attendance, managing files, and communicating with parents and staff.

4. Accounts (1):

• The account manager will handle the financial transactions of the school, such as tuition collection, payroll, and budgeting.

5. PT & Sports Teachers (2):

• These two staff members will work on physical activities, organize inter-school competitions, physical fitness, and sports day events.

6. Religious Education Teacher (1):

• The Muslim Religious Teacher will provide religious education and ensure students receive adequate guidance regarding Islamic studies and prayers.

7. Cooks (3):

• Three cooks will be responsible for preparing food for the boarding students. They will maintain food hygiene, handle the menu planning, and serve nutritious meals.

8. Kids Caretakers (2):

• The caretakers will supervise the students living in the accommodation. They will ensure that students maintain discipline, help with personal hygiene, and organize recreational activities.

9. Security Guards (2):

• Ensuring the safety of the entire school compound, especially the hostel section where students live overnight.

10. Support Staff (Tea Boy, Office Boy):

- **Tea Boy:** Responsible for providing tea and beverages to staff and students.
- Office Boy: Helps with general tasks around the office such as photocopying, filing, and running errands.

6. Key Assumptions:

- **Classroom Setup:** Each classroom will have a teacher for specific subjects. The student-to-teacher ratio is **1:30** for day scholars.
- **Accommodation:** The boarding section will have adequate facilities for 150 students, with a high level of supervision and care.
- **Security:** All areas of the school, including the boarding sections, will be monitored by security guards.

This project provides a comprehensive staff breakdown for managing the educational, administrative, and accommodation needs of a school with **300 students**.
